

Many people, who have built new homes over this period, have continued to have a good experience – but equally, you hear stories about people who have been negatively impacted by factors such as struggling to get finance, massive delays with getting title and resource and / or building consent, huge price rises and some significant supply and labour shortages.

Chris Ballantyne is a trade qualified carpenter, a registered Master Builder and a Site 2 Licensed Building Practitioner. Chris has been building for over 30 years and together Chris and his wife Tanya own Longview Homes in the Eastern Bay of Plenty / Whakatane area. Over the years Chris has seen massive housing booms and he's also been through some pretty tough times. Chris has strategically survived the global financial crisis and various other ups and downs in the market.

We recently took some time out of Chris's busy schedule and asked if he could help us "Be in the Know" about the secret to a successful build in the current market.

Firstly, In the Current Market Why Should we Build a New Home vs. Renovating or Buying an Existing Home?

When weighing up renovating or buying an existing home as opposed to building



a new home, I would always recommend going with a new home, perhaps change to if it fits your budget?if you can afford it. You get to design every part of your new home from scratch, so you get exactly what you want, and it is customised to your specific needs, not someone else's.

The government is encouraging people to build new and as a result banks seem far more willing to lend money to people looking to build a new home, and brand-new homes are typically valued higher.

A new home is built to the latest building code, reducing your living costs as power bills and maintenance are significantly cheaper.

A new home is also healthier because it is far better insulated, warmer dryer and properly ventilated.

When Is the Best Time to Build?

The age old saying that today is the cheapest time to build will always be true. After 33 years in the building game, I have never ever come across a situation where building costs have gone down. Next month or next year will always be more expensive.

When it comes to the best time of year to build, we are lucky to be able to build all year round in New Zealand. The New Zealand climate is generally pretty mild without too many extremes. For this reason, we generally have no more hesitation building a new home in the winter than we do in the summer.

What Is the Key to A Successful Build?

Always communication and organisation!

It is virtually impossible to foresee everything, so communication is key. For this reason, building is very much a contact sport, you need to problem solve and trouble shoot - it is important that you and your builder stay in close contact throughout the build. It is critical for

both parties (the builder and new homeowner) to work with people they respect and can easily get along with.

When it comes to organisation, figuring out all the requirements and details early on and planning well ahead, generally eliminates any unexpected surprises.

What Can We Do, To Avoid Getting Caught out By Price Rises?

This is a tricky question that unfortunately doesn't always have an easy answer.

The biggest thing you can do is choose a builder with very strong relationships with suppliers and sub-contractors and a strong reputation for paying their bills on time. When times get tough, suppliers and sub-contractors tend to remember who has looked after them and shown them loyalty and respect years. Suppliers over the sub-contractors will tend to prioritise these people and do their utmost to look after them when it comes to honouring prices that were quoted.

Sometimes there may also be an option to purchase some materials or supplies early and hold them for the build if predicted increases are foreseen.

What Can We Do, To Avoid Getting Caught Out By Supply Shortages?

Once again, choosing a builder with very strong relationships with suppliers and sub-contractors certainly helps. We've been dealing with the same suppliers and sub-contractors for well over 20 years. The relationships we have are extremely valuable to both parties. We look after them and whenever possible they look after us. They put materials aside for us and ring us if they are getting short of items. They will place orders well in advance and carry extra stock just for us. Equally our subcontractors always make an effort to fit us into their busy schedules.

In these times where certain supply lines are very tight, we use our experience and expertise to plan much further ahead than we normally would. We inform our suppliers of our upcoming requirements early and work to secure certain items well in advance.

Sometimes we talk to our suppliers before we make product selections and overcome problems by selecting and choosing items that we know are going to be available.

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






Eastbay REAP Collaborate with Partners to



By the time G Force George was five or six, she had a pretty good idea about what she wanted to do in life. Rebecca Magdalinos, as she was known back then, grew up watching jet planes train high above the beach at Turakina. Just 15 minutes from the Ohakea Airforce Base, Rebecca got to watch jets tumble through the skies at swift speeds and she knew it was something she wanted to be involved in.

A "spectacular television ad" from the NZ military, which was fashioned around the Top Gun movie and feels, confirmed Rebecca's dream and she set her heart on being a pilot for the Royal New Zealand Airforce. So, when she was going through school, she always knew she needed a good understanding of science.

After graduating high school Rebecca applied for the Airforce, only to fail some of the physical testing which would rule her out of ever being a pilot. This didn't stop G Force Gorge however, and rather than ending her dream to work with jets it just diverted her to the path she was meant to take.

Now days, Squadron Leader Rebecca is an Aeronautical Engineer with the Airforce. She is currently under secondment and appearing as G Force George with the Nanogirl experience. She realises it has been her experience in the science and engineering space that has helped her understand the importance of this area of knowledge for the next generations.

Nanogirl is a movement to inspire, educate and empower through science, technology, engineering and math – or STEM. It delivers workshops and shows facilitated by qualified scientists to improve understanding of STEM in learners of all ages.

Rebecca says she knows first-hand how important it is to get kids interested in STEM subjects early. That's why she is enjoys her mahi with Nanogirl because she gets to showcase how cool STEM can be.

She says there is evidence that suggests most children know, or at least have an idea, what they want to do in life by the time they are 12. A key component to helping kids get into science, technology, engineering, or maths is contextual learning.

The principle of "contextual learning" explores how bringing learning into a familiar, fun context can make the experience more meaningful to students.




As part of the process of exploring content across different contexts and seeing how it is relevant, a contextualised learning experience prepares students for life outside the classroom. Students start to conceptualise how the knowledge they have gained during their studies is relevant to their intended profession, the workplace, other aspects of life, and the world more broadly.

Contextualising learning in this way allows a more seamless transition from higher education to the world of work. For example, conducting and designing experiments with the scientific method and enquiry helps science students think critically about assumptions of knowledge that are pervasive in society.

This is why Eastbay Rural Education Activities Programme (Eastbay REAP) was keen on bringing the Nanogirl experience to the Eastern Bay and showcasing STEM to learners of all ages. The House of Science team at Eastbay REAP is focused on bringing science experts like Nanogirl to rural communities.





At the end of May, the team from Nanogirl spent a week in the rohe delivering workshops to teaching staff and assembly shows to tamariki.

G Force George, or Rebecca as she is legally known, was joined in the experience by fellow Nanogirl communicators including Marine Scientist Georgia "Super Snapper" Third and "Tornado" Tammy Rush. They visited 10 schools and delivered workshops to hundreds of teachers in the motu.

This opportunity was driven by the local community and supported by Eastbay REAP and its partners including the three Community of Learning: Kahui Ako (CoL) and local House of Science sponsors.

Eastbay REAP Schools Sector Lead Courtney Andrews says the focus of the Nanogirl weeklong visit was to help kaiako grow their STEM skill base so collectively they can open the eyes and minds of learners through impactful STEM learning.

"Science education has never been important, with the pandemic and climate change issues bringing science conversations into our communities and homes. STEM skills help develop critical thinking and problem solving which we know are essential for our students' future success in a fast-changing world."

The vision of Eastbay REAP: Ka ako te katoa, tuhonohono te katoa, is about learning and connection.

"Eastbay REAP supports connecting the community to lifelong learning through educational programmes, courses, resources and events for educators, parents, whānau, groups and individuals. There is no one-size-fits-all when it comes to learning, so our programmes are tailored to meet a range of needs. We work through an easy step-by-step approach to establish what is needed and how we can help.

"We are dedicated to supporting and guiding kaiako across the rohe removing identified barriers for equal access to opportunities. As a result, we had kaiako coming in from the East Coast to participate in the Nanogirl workshops as well as us going to their rohe."

Eastbay REAP moves within the motu from Whangaparoa to Rotoma over to Ōtamarakau and

The Eastbay REAP House of Science team say as a result collaboration with groups and organisations is key to providing opportunities to explore and enhance teaching methods across the rohe using resources like the Nanogirl experience.

The team shared that the week with Nanogirl began with an all-day professional development workshop at the Eastbay REAP offices in Whakatāne on the Monday. The workshop involved 40 kaiako and its aim was to inspire, educate and empower educators to grow their STEM confidence and capabilities.

Workshops for kaiako were also delivered at Apanui Primary School, Whakatāne Intermediate, Öhope Beach School and Te Kura o Te Whānau-ā-Āpanui during the week so their educators could have access to the opportunity without having to leave their workplace. The hands-on workshops were designed to give kaiako practical enquiryled experiments that use common items found in homes and schools.

In addition, 10 schools also signed up to have The Nanogirl Science Assembly Show. An interactive one-hour live show, presented by scientists who are experts in their fields, it showcased a range of exciting experiments that brought science and engineering to life for the tamariki.

Courtney says Eastbay REAP will continue to work with their partners to continue to provide these types of opportunities and shine a greater light on STEM and contextual learning. She says the hope is to inspire the next generation of innovators.

"After university, I went travelling and learned about all the deliciousness throughout Europe." she says.

"I was living in London and not loving it, so didn't quite know what to do next. A good friend of mine had been working on the superyachts for a while, so he convinced me to try it out for a season

"I fell into a cheffing job on a gorgeous yacht, and from there I knew that I'd found my calling!"

Maddie has spent more than five years on-and-off cooking fancy food on superyachts, and says it's a very unique industry to work in.

"I loved working on the yachts.
"I had to learn very quickly the techniques for cooking for people of all different cultures, preferences, and dietary requirements – all while having limited access to ingredients. These people expect a lot and you have to deliver! I thrived off

that though... opening the fridge and planning a mult course dinner from whatever is could find.

"Yacht cheffing is quite different to other types of cheffing. You're very much at the beck and call of the guests, and you really have to be able to think on the spot to produce exactly what they ask for at the drop of a hat. Organisation and preparation is key, and it helps to be flexible minded and innovative."

Maddie says once she'd discovered her passion for superyachts and cheffing, she wanted to upskill and formalise her profession.

"After a season on a yacht, I decided to formalise my skills and I moved to Paris to complete a grande diplome in cuisine and patisserie at Le Cordon Bleu.

"That year I learned so much about food. Both from school and also from being around the French.

"They celebrate the seasons, and revel in quality and simplicity. It was such a joy to experience."

Maddie says her time at Le Cordon Bleu in Paris was "the most incredible experience" and says she is grateful for her time there.

"Every morning I would bubble over with excitement for the challenges of the day ahead.

"I completed the grand diplome, which was one year of cuisine and patisserie. The days were long, formal and challenging, bu I got such a kick out of everything I was learning.

"I felt as though that year I was a sponge absorbing every drop of knowledge anyone would feed me; not just from school, but also from just being Paris.

"Traipsing from one side of the city to the other with my friends from culinary schoo to taste the best almond croissant or trying to narrow down our 'to-try restaurant list down to something our bank accounts and stomach capacity could handle, was a weekly activity."

Her time in Paris has certainly influenced her food – as has her other travel, she says but she's a fan of playing with flavour.

"My cooking style very much comes from French foundations, but I like to play around with flavours and spices and lot more than the French do.

"Probably growing up in New Zealand or delicious Asian foods has influenced that and all my travels to other countries very much swayed my tastebuds to new cooking techniques and flavours.

"Aside from France, I'd say Israel and Mexico were two countries where I totally immersed myself into tasting everything is could and being completely obsessed with the tastes."

After receiving her diploma at the world's Best Culinary Training Institution – as voted by the World Culinary Awards – she decided it was time to reboard the supervachts.

"After a few more years on yachts, peppered with lots of travel throughout Europe and Northern America, I was ready to set some roots and move home."

She returned home to Tauranga where she started her own private cheffing business.

"It was such a natural transition from yachting to private cheffing for me," she says.

"I get to spend my days designing menus and cooking beautiful food for all types of people who really value what I do. All while being land based – so no more sea-sickness for me!"

Starting her own business and being her own boss seemed like a natural fit for Maddie when she moved home.

"I was so excited to work for myself and have complete autonomy over what it cooked, and who I was serving that to," she says.

"Private cheffing and small scale catering made the most sense to me.

"It means I can create very individualised menus for clients based on what they love the style of function they're hosting, and very importantly - what's in season."







Maddie says it's important to her to support small and keep things as local, fresh and organic as she can.

"Private cheffing also means I can stick entirely to my values of buying from local producers, free range and organic where possible – all for clients who I know will appreciate these things.

"Most people I cook for have come about from word of



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STICKY DATE PUDDING

Ingredients

11/2 CUP OF DATES (PITTED + CHOPPED)

11/2 CUPS OF MILK

11/2 TEASPOON BAKING SODA

11/2 CUP OF BROWN SUGAR

2 TEASPOON CINNAMON

1/4 TEASPOON SALT

11/2 CUP OF ALL PURPOSE FLOUR

11/2 CUP BUTTER(UNSALTED)

For the Sauce

2 CUP OF BROWN SUGAR

1/2 CUP OF BUTTER

300 MLS OF FRESH CREAM
TEASPOONS VANILLA EXTRACT

Instructions

- 1. In a Saucepan bring milk to boil over a high heat, remove and stir in the dates and baking soda. Allow to cool for 10-15minutes.
- 2. With an electric wizz, cream butter and brown sugar until it turns into a nice pale colour.
- 3. Fold in date mixture gently.
- 4. Sift in the flour, cinnamon, and salt. Stir the mixture until everything is combined evenly.
- 5.Preheat Oven to 180 degrees and grease a square or sponge tin or baby ramekins with butter.
- 6. Spoon the mixture into tin/ramekins
- 7. Bake for 30 minutes or until a skewer inserted comes out clean.

Method for Caramel Sauce

1. Put all the ingredients into a saucepan, on a low heat stir until it has thickened and reduce to a nice smooth caramel colour, serve with sticky date pudding by pouring the sauce over the top.

MUSHROOM + BACON SOUP

Ingredients

- 7 SLICES OF BACON CHOPPED
- 3 TABLESOONS OF BUTTER
- 2 ONIONS, DICED
- 3 GARLIC CLOVES DICED THINLY
- 500 GRAMS OF MUSHROOMS SLICED
- 2 TABLESPOONS OF CORN FLOUR OR
 ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR, ¼ CUP OF
 MILK, MIX AND MAKE A PASTE
- 1 LITRE CHICKEN STOCK
- 1/2 CUP HEAVY CREAM
- 2 TABLESPOONS FINELY CHOPPED FRESH FLAT-LEAF PARSLEY
- GRATED PARMESAN CHEESE
- SALT AND PEPPER

Instructions

Heat a large pot with the butter add the onion and garlic until nice and soft, then add the bacon. Stir for about 3 minutes until the bacon is cooked, then add the mushrooms and season with some salt a pepper.

Stir in the flour paste, stir well, then add the stock and reduce down for a further 3 minutes. Then add the cream and some parsley.

Simmer until it starts to thicken.

Before serving sprinkle over a little parmesan cheese.





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
